

## CSU Yellow Ribbon Program Participant Agreement - Veteran

As a way of saying thank you to military families for the many sacrifices they have made, Colorado State University is participating in the Yellow Ribbon Program effective August 2011. The VA is limiting the tuition benefit payment to the amount of resident tuition.

For students who are entitled to the Post 9/11 GI Bill at the 100% level and are classified as nonresident, Colorado State University will cover 50% of the difference in resident and nonresident tuition and the VA will match that amount. The result of this is that all tuition and mandatory fees will be fully covered.

As a student who is entitled to the Post 9/11 GI Bill at the 100% level, and who is being assessed nonresident tuition and thereby receiving the benefit of the Yellow Ribbon Program, I understand that if I apply for financial aid, I will not be eligible for any additional State of Colorado or Colorado State University institutional aid. Should it occur, because of timing issues, that I am inadvertently granted additional state or CSU aid, I understand Colorado State University will be required to reverse that aid. Any outside grants, scholarships or federal aid will be unaffected unless any are specified to be applied exclusively to tuition and/or fees, which is rarely, if ever, the case. The usual language states funds can be used for any "cost of attendance".
