

Colorado State University Transfer Guide and Planning Worksheet
for the IGETC – Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum

This planning worksheet represents a guide for Cuesta College students transferring to Colorado State University (CSU) with a completed IGETC. This transfer guide can be used in two ways:

1. If the student completes an IGETC at Cuesta College, this Transfer Guide identifies the courses a student needs to complete (with a C- or higher) in order to be able to come in with a complete AUCC core. In this role, the planning worksheet serves as a transfer guide.
2. If more than 64 college-level credits are taken at the community/junior college, some loss of transfer credit may occur and students may not be able to complete this baccalaureate degree in 120 credits.

Additional Information:

- If the student intends to transfer prior to completing an IGETC, this Transfer Guide should still be used to identify the courses that can most effectively prepare them for efficiently completing the AUCC core requirements at CSU. While not completing the required IGETC eliminates any agreements described above, all the individual general education courses identified below in Section I are guaranteed to transfer and to count toward fulfilling CSU's lower division general education requirements.
- Completion of the curriculum prescribed within this agreement does not guarantee admission to Colorado State University. Students must meet all admission and application requirements at Colorado State University including the submission of all required documentation by stated deadlines.
- Only courses with grades of C- or higher are guaranteed to transfer.
- The credit and course transfer guarantees described in this agreement only apply to the IGETC requirements at Cuesta College covered by this agreement. Colorado State University will evaluate application of the courses designated in this agreement to other degree programs on a course-by-course basis.
- Students who wish to use credits awarded by exam, such as AP (Advanced Placement), or IB (International Baccalaureate), to fulfill specific course requirements of their IGETC are responsible for consulting with Colorado State University to determine whether the credits they have been awarded by exam meet the standards for specific course equivalents.
- [Transferology](#) enables students, advisors, faculty, and administrators from colleges and universities to obtain consistent and accurate information about how courses will transfer from one institution to another, and how those courses will apply to meet academic program requirements at the other institutions. A potential transfer student can have direct access to course acceptability, equivalency, and applicability among all participating institutions by using each institution's existing course equivalency tables.

4-Students planning on taking MATH 130 should double check the CSU major requirements to ensure this course will fulfill the required mathematics course for your major. Not all majors accept MATH 130 as the appropriate mathematics course for fulfilling degree requirements.

Students who do not complete an IGETC can use the prescribed curriculum within this document as a common advising guide for transfer to Colorado State University for fulfillment of the All University Core Curriculum requirements for a baccalaureate degree program.

Please note the following:

1. Except in special cases (e.g., the partial completion of a required sequence of courses or variation in the number of credit hours institutions award for course equivalents), students can expect that courses specified within the prescribed curriculum in this agreement that are successfully completed with a C- or higher will fulfill the relevant course requirements in the designated major.
2. Colorado State University will evaluate all courses other than those specified in this agreement on a course-by-course basis.

Students transferring without a completed IGETC must consult with the Office of Admissions at the institution to which they are considering transferring to review the issues identified above and to make sure they meet all admission and application requirements at the receiving institution, including the submission of all required documentation by stated deadlines.

This agreement will remain in force until such time as the curriculum of the degree program changes or a participating institution requests reconsideration of the terms of the agreement.
